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



The **y** at the end of words with more than one syllable represents a **long e sound**. Practice saying the **long e sound** using the picture of the mouth below. Sound out the following word.





Practice saying the **sh sound**. This is the sound a parent might say to comfort her crying baby. Use the pictures of the mouth as a reference. Then sound out the word.




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

Practice saying the **long o sound**. Use the pictures of the mouth as a reference. Then sound out the word.
